## Complete, Correct, and Current

## Complete the address

Leverage software and data to provide the missing information ZIP $+4^{\circledR}$, street name, city, state, directional

## Correct

the address
Verifies address is deliverable Corrects misspellings
Provides approved abbreviations
(Publication 28)
Ensures the city, state, and ZIP Code ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ are correct

Keep the address Current

Pers on, family, or business moved
Municipality introduced changes
Ongoing process
Improves data matching and consolidation

# Yet, we still have a major UAA Is sue 

In 2022, the USPS ${ }^{\circledR}$ reported

- Over 5.5 billion pieces of Undeliverable As Addressedmail pieces
- 3.1 billion were Marketing Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$
- 2.2 billion were First-Class Mai® ${ }^{\circledR}$

Cost to the USPS and in industry, over \$1.3B

- \$226 million to forward
- $\$ 862$ million to return to sender
- $\$ 274$ million treated as waste
otal UAA Mail Volume

2022 Unit Cost per piece

- Waste $=\$ 0.080$
- Forwarded = \$0.292
- Returned $=\$ 0.644$

## CASS ${ }^{m}$ Product

- USPS certified benchmark
- Sets minimum performance standards for commercial ZIP+4 address matching software
- Developers must pass USPS test for CASS ${ }^{w}$ certification
- Address matching software attempts to match addresses against rangebased records on USPS ZIP+4 files
- Provides carrier route assignment
- Pre-Mailing process

## DPVQ-DELIVERY POINT VALIDATION

- Extension of CASS Certified Address Matching software
- Available through software vendors
- Enhances ZIP+4 Coding \& identifies potentially undeliverable addresses
- DPV- extra step to attempt validation of each specific address in the file

## LACS-ink®

- A process that converts addresses that are changed by local governments
- Rural route to street style conversion
- Renumbering changes
- Street name changes

| Old Style | New Style |
| :--- | :--- |
| RR 5 Box 234 | 5471 Apple Drive |
| 471 Main St | 1471 Main St |
| 987 Edgewater Dr | 987 Waterways Blvd |

Delivery point remains the same and the residents have not moved, but the address has been changed.

## SUITELink®

Improves address assignments to business addresses by adding known secondary (suite) numbers

Provided a business name and an associated ZIP +4 coded address matches to a high-rise default, the Suite ${ }^{\text {Link }}$ process will return the appropriate suite number when a vailable

## DNA = Door-Not Accessible

- Addresses where we cannot knock on a door to deliver mail that will not fit into the mailbox.
- Intended for any situation where we cannot physically get to the residence/building
- Software must return "Y" when DoorNot Accessible address is found on the table.
- Implement prior to Cycle O Testing - Yes


Long Driveway/Access Road


Gated Community/Residence

## NSL = No. Secure Location

- Door is accessible, but a package will not be left due to security concerns.
- Software must return "Y" when No Secure Location address is found on the table.
- Implement prior to Cycle O Testing - Yes



## NDD = Non-Delivery Days

- Mail delivery is not performed every day of the week:
- Business closed on Saturday \& does not want mail delivered.
- Delivery Route runs Monday, Wednesday, Fridayonly
- Seven(7) fields representing Delivery Days are included for each address on the table.
- Software must return a "Y" for each day that represents the day(s) that do not receive delivery when the address is found on the table.
- Implement prior to Cycle O Testing - Yes

## NCOA-ink@ - National Change of address

- USPS licensed product using address change information when individuals or businesses inform the USPS of their move
- Provides electronic Changeof-Address information
- Average correction rate (with new address)- 3.32\%
- Three different license types
- Variable costs
- Pre-Mailing process

- Return Code $=32$, which means a "Default Highrise Match"; ZIP+4 Code of 3862 is applied
- DPV Code = 'D' and the Footnote code = "AAN1", which means the secondary number is mis ing

## Advanced Address Resolution Services

## By leveraging USPS compliant data plus industry provided data sources, and searching on the name data in addition to the address data, we can correct ambiguous addresses or fix difficult address quality issues

Transposed Primary Number Example
Input Address
John Smith
231 Main Street
Rochester NY 14623

## Corrected Address

John Smith
123 Main Street
Rochester NY 14623-3201

Secondary Address Information Example

Corrected Address John Smith
123 Main Street Apt 10
Rochester NY 14623-3260

## Proprietary change of address service

- Proprietary Change of Address (PCOA) provides inferred change, of-address data for non-business name and address matches to an industry provided aggregated source of industry available data
- PCOA provides an indicator of whether a multisource match occurred or not
- PCOA data can sometimes be useful to assist with chained moves when leveraged with 48-month NCOA ${ }^{\text {link }}$ data

Example of a chained move for J ohn Smith:

Lived at his parent's address: 1583 Elm ST
Rochester, NY 14623
$\qquad$
Did file a USPS
NCOA

## Mail Service Providers - Challenges with Address Quality

- NCOA ${ }^{\text {ink }}$ is great, but it can be a pain in the PAF!
- The Process Acknowledgement Form is required for NCOA-ink
- If the USPS would permit limited use of the NCOA ${ }^{\text {ink }}$ data to simply flag Yes or No that a move is filed, this foreknowledge could assist in reducing UAA and costly assessments
- Legal Restraint is an option for Move Update compliance, but has a lot of requirements and requires additional mail pieces



## Mail Service Providers are on the Front Line

- USPS Mailer Scorecard errors are assessed to theeDoc submitter, which is usually the Mail Service Provider
- This is part of the reason why many mailers are reluctant to go into Seamless Acceptance - fear of additional unbudgeted scorecard errors
- Assessments can be thousands of dollars
- Very difficult for an MSP to determine which mailing caused the penalty and even more challenging to attempt to collect from the mail owner
- Move Update compliance tolerance is $0.5 \%$, and the penalty per piece is $\$ .08$
- Note that Periodicals are required to use ACS, and thus are not subject to the Move Update census-based verification process


## Mail Owners Assume USPS and Other Agencies Share Data

- Mail owners consider the USPS a government entity and do not understand why other agencies such as DMV and SSA do not share data
- State DMV offices may encourage people to file a change of address with the USPS, but not everyone does that and it's an extra step
- Deceased suppression notification
- Social Security Administration has data on deceased individuals
- Could NCOA ${ }^{\text {ink }}$ be enhanced to carry this data as a special change of address?
- Note that ACS as an additional Move Update method does have a deceased indicator, but not all mail owners are updating their lists after the mailing and this data is dependent on carrier knowledge


## The Future for Address Quality

- Secure Destruction
- NCOA-ink single address correction
- COAlertto simply note if a move has been filed
- Geocoding and USPS Mobile Delivery Devices
- CASS Cycle O
